## **Hardt Foundation – Research Scholarships**

**The Hardt Foundation for the Study of Classical Antiquity, in Vandœuvres, near Geneva, takes great pleasure in announcing a new programme of research scholarships for young researchers.**

**These awards will cover the cost of visits to the Hardt Foundation, for periods of two weeks to two months.**

### Conditions

The Hardt Foundation for the Study of Classical Antiquity, in Vandœuvres, Switzerland, in pursuit of its ambition to promote the study and awareness of the culture and civilization of Greco-Roman antiquity, offers young researchers (normally up to 35 years of age) the possibility to apply for research awards financing stays of between two weeks and two months, with the possibility of extension.

The awards cover the cost of residence at « La Chandoleine », home of the Hardt Foundation, in Vandœuvres (single room, full board) as well as a portion of travel costs (on presentation of original tickets).

Please note that the grants of the Hardt Foundation do not cover the summer months.

Applicants must submit a file including the following documents:

- ◇ a curriculum vitæ
- ◇ a letter explaining the reason for studying at the Hardt Foundation
- ◇ a programme of research
- ◇ for applicants who are not University Professors (Full, Associate or Assistant Professor), a description of their career plans and two letters of recommendation from University Professors

to the President of the Hardt Foundation, at the address given below.

The areas of research supported by these awards are Greek and Latin Language and Literature, Ancient History and Ancient Philosophy. The aim of the research is the publication of articles, books or other written contributions.

At the end of their stay, researchers will be required to submit a brief report on their research, and they are requested to mention the support of the Hardt Foundation in any publication arising from work undertaken during their tenure of the award.
